Croeso i'r Wyl Serameg Ryngwladol 2019. Yn cael ei chynnal bob yn ail flwyddyn, sefydlwyd yr Wyl fel gwersyll i grochenwyr Gogledd a De Cymru a hon oedd yr Wyl gyntaf yn y DU i nodweddu seramegyddion rhyngwladol yn ôl ym 1987. Mae'r Wyl yn adnabyddus am gyflwyno taniau ysblennydd ac ni chewch eich siomi eto eleni. 'Rydym yn adeiladu ac yn tanio odynau o bob math a maint ac yn mynd un cam ymhellach eleni gyda thaniad dramatig a difyr gyda cherddoriaeth.

Yn 2019, daw ein seramegyddion detholedig o mor bell i ffwrdd â Florida a Siapan ac mor agos â Sir Ddinbych a Sir Benfro. Mae eu gwaith yn amrywio o ddarnau manwl a chywraint i ddarnau mawr trawiadol, yn defnyddio amrediad helaeth o dechnegau. Gallwch weld yr arddangoswyr ar y llwyfan, mewn darlithoedd ac yn eu llefydd gwaith o gwmpas y safle lle maent yn hapus i sgwrsio am eu gwaith a'r prosesau a ddefnyddir.

From the four finalists, one maker will receive a Visiting Artist Award to take place at the Jingdezhen Sanbao Ceramic Art Institute in 2020. Festival visitors will be asked to vote for a winner from the four Emerging Makers based on their presentations and work on display in the Emerging Maker's exhibition. INTERNATIONAL CERAMICS STUDIO KECSKEMÉT & ICF RESIDENCY AWARD



Since 2017, the International Ceramics Studio (ICS) Kecskemét, Hungary has offered a residency opportunity open to ceramic practitioners including mid-career and late adopters of ceramics. The ICS Artist-in-Residence program allows artists to work in the context of a different country and culture. ICS director Steve Mattison

Master of Ceremonies Jim Robison

Jim is an elected Fellow of the British Craft Potters Association, former Chair of the Northern Potters Association. An enthusiastic maker and educator, Jim has taken part in every Aberystwyth Festival and been Master of Ceremonies for most of them. Jim has written for Ceramics publications and is author of Large Scale Ceramics, and co-author of Slab Techniques. Raised and educated in the USA, he moved to Yorkshire in 1972, and established Booth House Gallery and Studio in Holmfirth. His own work is usually slab built using personal construction techniques combined with unusual surface textures using multiple layers of clay and glaze.

Ingrid Murphy

Ingrid Murphy is a practising ceramic artist currently collaborating with others on digital fabrication technologies. She has diverse experience in both ceramic education and practice nationally and internationally. She is currently the academic lead for trans-disciplinarity at Cardiff School of Art & Design. Her research is in maker culture and interdisciplinary education. She is currently undertaking a British Council Research project in China. Ingrid will also give a lecture about her exhibition 'Seen and Unseen' showing in Gallery 1 (see Lectures and Exhibitions).

Lars Tharp

Our Honorary Festival President is the well-known Ceramics Historian, Lars Tharp. He studied prehistoric archaeology at Caius College, Cambridge, and later joined Sotheby's, specialising in Chinese ceramics. Through his company Lars Tharp Ltd (www.tharp.co.uk), he advises on all aspects of ceramics and on the acquisition, care and disposal of art in general. Lars broadcasts frequently on TV and on radio (BBC3 and BBC4) and is a regular expert on the Antiques Roadshow. Every Festival, Lars gives a lecture specially written for the festival (see Lectures).

Patia Davis (y DU)



'Roedd Patia Davis yn fyfyrwraig i Mick Casson. Heddiw mae'n creu priddwaith yn Wobage, wedi'i addurno gyda slip ochr yn ochr â phorslen sglein sy'n cael ei danio ar dymheredd uchel. Gwnaethpwyd Patia yn Gymrawd o'r CPA yn 2015, ac mae hi wedi arddangos ei gwaith yn y DU, Siapan ac Ewrop. Bydd Patia yn dangos ei phroses o drin arwynebedd ei nwyddau domestig sef platiâu, dysglau a chwpanau. Yn defnyddio ei throell gic a phorslen Limoges, bydd Patia yn arddangos sut i daflu'n glocwedd ac yn wrthglocwedd er mwyn creu ffitiadau sgrïw ar ei jariau a photeli cloriedig.

Kaku Hayashi (Siapan)



Kaku Hayashi yw un o seramegyddion benywaid mwyaf blaenllaw Siapan. Mae'n creu ffurffau cerfluniol ar raddfa fawr a ysbyrdolir gan natur. Datblygodd broses i gyflymu'r proses sychu trwy ychwanegu sylwedd mwnol o wydr folcanig 'kantaró', at y clai. Yn 1992, derbyniodd Kaku Hayashi ddiagnosis o ganer; foddy bynnag, diflannodd y tiwmor yn sydyn o'i wirfodd ei hun. Cafodd y profiad effaith fawr arni a dechreuodd ymddiddori yn y syniad o gylch bywyd ac angau, gan greu darnau cylch sfferaidd. Dychmygodd 'Sero' fel y 'Dechrau a'r Diweddf', 'y Presennol a'r Gorffennol', ac 'Anfeidredd' gan fod ei ffurf yr un peth â 'Chylch' ('Wa' mewn Siapaneg).



Ashraf Hanna (yr Aifft/y DU)



Ganwyd Ashraf Hanna yn El Minia, yr Aifft, a bellach mae'n byw ac yn gweithio yn Sir Benfro, Gorllewin Cymru. Astudiodd Ashraf Ddylunio Theatr yn Central Saint Martins yn Llundain cyn darganfod clai ym 1996. Ar ôl sefydlu ymarfer llwyddiannus mewn serameg stiwdio, mynchyddodd y Coleg Celf Brenhinol rhwng 2009-11, gan ennill MA mewn serameg a gwydr. Cynrychioli ei waith mewn nifer o gasgliadau cyhoeddus a phrifat gan gynnwys y V&A, Amgueddfa Genedlaethol Cymru ac Amgueddfa Wydr Ernsting Stiftung Alter Hof Herding. Mae'n creu llestri cerfluniol a adeiledir â'r llaw yn defnyddio palet cynnil o slipiau pur a chlai staenedig.

Brendan Hesmondhalgh (y DU)



Mae Brendan Hesmondhalgh yn fwyaf adnabyddus am ei gerfluniau serameg ac efydd unigryw, a wneir â'r llaw, o anifeiliaid. Yn defnyddio slabiau o glai neu gwyr cerfluniol, mae Hesmondhalgh yn lapio, yn haenu ac yn rheoli'r cyfrwng i greu darnau unigryw sy'n cyfleo elfennau o gymeriad, ffurf a symudiad pob creadur unigol. Cafodd

ei eni yn Sir Gaerhirfryn yn Lloegr ym 1973 a threuliodd ychydig o amser yng Ngogledd Cymru cyn ymgymryd â chwrs serameg gerfluniol yng Ngholeg Celf Caeredin ym 1994. Mae'r arwynebedd yn elfen bwysig yn ei waith, ac mae'n ei ddatblygu trwy ychwanegu lliw a marciau cyfeiriol a gweadol i loywi pob ffurf.

Rebecca Hutchinson (UDA)



Mae gweithiau cerfluniol a safle-penodol Rebecca Hutchinson yn cael eu dylanwadu gan ddeinameg ecosystem a materion amgylcheddol. Mae hi wedi derbyn Gwobr Artist New England ac mae'n gymrawd o Sefydliad Pollock-Krasner, Sefydliad Puffin, Comisiwn Diwylliannol Virginia, Cyngor Celfyddydau Gogledd Carolina a Chomisiwn Celfyddydau Virginia. Demonstrators

Patia Davis (UK)



Patia Davis was a student of Mick Casson's. She makes slip decorated earthenware alongside high-fired ash and feldspathic glazed porcelain at Wobage today. Patia was made a Fellow of the CPA in 2015, and has exhibited in the UK, Japan and Europe. Patia will demonstrate her approach to the surface treatment of her domestic flatware platters, dishes and bakers. Using her kick wheel and Limoges porcelain, Patia will demonstrate throwing clockwise and anti-clockwise to create screw threaded fittings on her lidded jars and bottles.

Kaku Hayashi (Japan)



Kaku Hayashi is one of the leading female ceramicists in Japan. She makes large scale sculptural forms inspired by nature. She developed a process to speed up the drying process adding a volcanic glass mineral substance 'kan-taro', to the clay. In 1992, Kaku Hayashi was diagnosed with cancer; however, the tumour suddenly disappeared of its own accord. The experience affected her profoundly and she became concerned with the cycle of life and death and began making spherical ring pieces. She imagined 'Zero' as the Beginning and Ending', 'Present and Past', and 'Infinity' since its form is same as 'Ring' (Japanese 'Wa').



Ashraf Hanna (Egypt/UK)



Ashraf Hanna was born in El Minia, Egypt and is now living and working in Pembrokeshire, West Wales. Ashraf initially studied Theatre Design at Central Saint Martins in London before discovering clay in 1996. After establishing a successful practice in studio ceramics, he attended The Royal College of Art between 2009-11, gaining an MA in ceramics and glass .His work is represented in a number of public and private collections including the V&A, the National Museum of Wales and Ernsting Stiftung Alter Hof Herding Glass Museum. He makes hand built sculptural vessels using a restrained palette of refined slips and stained clays.

Brendan Hesmondhalgh (UK)



Brendan Hesmondhalgh is best known for his unique handmade ceramic and bronze sculptures of animals. Using slabs of clay or sculptural wax, Hesmondhalgh wraps, layers

and controls the medium to create one-off pieces that capture elements of character, form and movement of each individual creature. He was born in Lancashire, England in 1973 and spent some time in North Wales before studying at a sculptural ceramic course at Edinburgh College of Art in 1994. The surface remains a focused element that he continues to develop, adding colour, directional and textural marks to enhance each form.

Rebecca Hutchinson (USA)



Rebecca Hutchinson's sculptural and site-specific works are influenced by ecosystem dynamics and environmental concerns. She is a New England Artist Award recipient and fellowship recipient from The Pollock-Krasner Foundation, The Puffin Foundation, Virginia Cultural Commission, The North Carolina Arts Council and The Virginia Commission of the Arts. She has exhibited widely in the USA and Europe. Using traditional and non-traditional ceramic materials and processes, her work focuses on the respect for process and the endless influences found in nature. She will be building a site-responsive clay structure using recycled paper.

Wendy Lawrence (y DU)



Derbyniodd Wendy Lawrence radd BA mewn dylunio 3D (Serameg) o Brifysgol Sir Gaerhirfryn Ganolog ym 1998. Mae hi'n diwtor serameg ac mae wedi cymryd rhan mewn symposia a gweithdai ym Mhrydain, Ewrop ac America. Mae hi'n ymddiddor yn y gweadeddau ffurfiau daearegol naturiol a welir ganddi wrth iddi gerdded yng Ngogledd Cymru lle mae'n byw (Sir Ddinbych). Mae hi'n arbrofi gyda sglein gan ddefnyddio sylweddau hynod adweithedol er mwyn creu arwynebau gweadol cyfoethog i ysgogi strwythur naturiol strata'r graig. Daw Chen Min o Ddinas Zhaotong, Talaith Yunnan. Astudiodd yn Institiwt Serameg Jingdezhen ac mae'n byw 'nawr yn Ninjas Jingdezhen, Talaith Jiangxi. Mae wedi

gweithio yn y diwydiant serameg ers 20 mlynedd, yn arbenigo mewn amrediad o dechnegau addurnol yn cynnwys cerfio basgerfiad a gwaith brwsh a phaentio traddodiadol. Ar hyn o bryd mae hi'n uwch ddylunydd celf serameg yn Nhalaith Jiangxi, uwch ddylunydd celf yn Jingdezhen ac yn aelod o Gymdeithas Celf Serameg Hong Kong. Ers 2002 mae hi wedi ennill llawer o wobrau arian ac aur mewn arddangosfeydd celf a chrefft a serameg yn Tsieina. Arddangosir ei gwaith yn Ffair Borslen Tsieina a'r Theatr Genedlaethol yn Beijing. Bydd Chen Min yn arddangos ei cherfio a gwaith brwsh ar deils Gorslen.

Phil Rogers (y DU)



Wedi'i eni yng Nghymru, mae Phil wedi byw a gweithio yn Rhaeadr, Canolbarth Cymru ers 1978. Mae ei botiau wedi eu taflu â'r llaw rhan amlaf ac maent yn ymarferol yn ôl traddodiad Eingl-Ddwyreiniol Bernard Leach. Ilona Romule (Latfia)

Ganwyd Ilona Romule yn Riga (Latfia) i mewn i deulu o artistiaid. Graddiodd o Academi Gelf Latfia ym 1985 (MFA mewn Serameg) ac ers hynny mae wedi gweithio fel artist ar ei liwt ei hun yn ei stiwdio yn Riga ac yn y Stiwdio Serameg Ryngwladol yn Kecskemét (Hwngari) ac yn Tsieina. Mae hi wedi bod yn arwain gweithdai creu mowldiau-plastr, lithoffan a phaentio tsieni mewn Prifysgolion a Chanolfannau Celfyddydol yn Latfia, Hwngari, UDA,



Tsieina, Awstralia, Twrci, Israel, Taiwan, Bali a Seland Newydd. Mae'n gweithio gyda phorslen tymheredd uchel ac yn canolbwytio'n bennaf ar y ffigwr. Bydd hi'n dod â cherflun i arddangos ei thechnegau paentio sy'n cynnwys addurniad gloyw.

Alisher Rakhimov



Ganwyd y meistr ar serameg Alisher Rakhimov yn Tashkent i mewn i deulu gyda thraddodiad hir (o leiaf chwe chenhedlaeth) o'r seramegyddion enwocaf yn Uzbekistan. Mae ef wedi arddangos yn Siapan, yr Almaen, UDA ac Israel a bu'n rhan o wahanol brosiectau UNESCO i adfywio technolegau serameg o'r gorffennol.

Demonstrators

Wendy Lawrence (UK)



Wendy Lawrence received a BA in 3D design (Ceramics) from the University of Central Lancashire in 1998. She is a ceramic tutor and has participated in symposia and workshops in Britain, Europe and America. She is interested in textures of natural geological forms which she observes on her walks in North Wales where she lives (Denbighshire). She experiments with glaze using highly reactive substances to create rich textural surfaces to evoke the natural structure of rock strata. She fires the work to 1260 degrees C in an electric kiln, varying the atmosphere from oxidation to heavy reduction. Wendy will carve a sculpture from a large solid block of clay.

Chen Min (China)



Chen Min is a native of Zhaotong City, Yunnan Province, she studied at Jingdezhen Ceramic Institute and now lives in Jingdezhen City, Jiangxi Province. She has worked in the ceramic industry for 20 years, specializing in a range of decorative techniques including bas-relief carving and traditional brushwork

and painting. She is currently a senior ceramic art designer in Jiangxi Province, a senior art designer in Jingdezhen and a member of the Hong Kong Ceramic Art Association. Since 2002 she has won many gold and silver awards at arts and crafts and ceramic exhibitions in China. Her works are on display at the China Porcelain Fair and the Beijing National Grand Theatre. Chen Min will demonstrate her carving and brushwork on porcelain tiles.

Phil Rogers (UK)



Born in Wales, Phil has lived and worked in Rhayader, mid Wales since 1978. His pots are usually hand thrown and functional in the Anglo-oriental tradition of Bernard Leach. He uses both salt-glaze and ash glazes in his work, giving a range of colours through greys and greens of celadon to warm oranges and rich dark tenmokus. An influential figure in British pottery, he has also written many books on ceramics. He has recently developed his 'Buncheong' work inspired and influenced by 15th and 16th century Korea. Phil will give throwing demonstrations with black clay.

Ilona Romule (Latvia)

Ilona Romule was born in Riga (Latvia) into a family of artists. She graduated from the Latvian Art Academy in 1985 (MFA in Ceramics) and has since worked as a freelance artist at her studio in Riga and at the International Ceramics Studio in Kecskemét (Hungary) and in China. She has been leading plaster-mold making, lithophane and China painting workshops at Universities and Art Centres in Latvia, Hungary, USA,



China, Australia, Turkey, Israel, Taiwan, Bali and New Zealand. She works with high temperature porcelain and mainly concentrates on the figure. She will bring a sculpture to demonstrate her painting techniques which includes lustre decoration.

Potters from Uzbekistan

Uzbekistan has a rich ceramic tradition where techniques are passed on through generations in pottery producing areas. Master potters Alisher Rakhimov (Tashkent) Abdulla Narzullaev (Bukhara) and Alisher Nazirov (Rishtan) will demonstrate their slip decorating techniques, as well as hand building.



Alisher Rakhimov



Master Ceramist Alisher Rakhimov was born in Tashkent into a family with a long tradition (at least six generations) of the most famous ceramics masters in Uzbekistan. He has exhibited in Japan, Germany, USA and Israel and been part of various UNESCO projects to revive ceramic technologies of the past. In

Alisher Nazirov



Alisher Nazirov o Rishtan yn Nwyrain Uzbekistan yw un o'r seramegyddion ac athrawon uchaf ei barch yn Uzbekistan. Yn dechrau yn 12 oed, astudiodd gyda nifer o feistri mawr Uzbek. Yn y cyfnod Sofietaidd ef oedd y prif artist yn Ffatri Serameg Gelf Rishtan. Treuliodd Nazirov amser yn Siapan yng nghanol y 1990au ac ymgymorodd â chyfnod preswyl gydag Isojichi Asakura, meistr crochenwaith enwog ysgol Kutani. Cyfraniad Nazirov at gynnal treftadaeth ddiwylliannol Uzbekistan oedd i sefydlu ysgol/gweithdy sef yr Ysgol 'Usto-Shogird' [Meistr-Myfyriwr]. Mae ef hefyd wedi bod ar y blaen wrth adfer ffurfliau a dyluniadau traddodiadol hynafol serameg Rishtan, gan ennill iddo'r teitl 'Ceidwad y Traddodiadau' yn 2016. Arddangosir ei waith mewn amgueddfeydd yn Uzbekistan, Rwsia ac Amgueddfa Serameg Asakura-san yn Komatsu.

Abdulla Narzullaev



Ganwyd Abdulla Narzullaev i mewn i deulu gydag o leiaf 6 chenhedaeth o feistri serameg a brodwaith o'i flaen. Daw o Bukhara, rhanbarth sy'n adnabyddus am ei serameg wydrog liwgar. Dysgodd ei grefft oddi wrth ei dad, yn dechrau'n 7 oed. Mae'n cyfaddef na fu erioed yn ystyried unrhyw broffesiwn arall gan fod crefft yn ei deulu ef yn cael ei throsglwyddo o genhedaeth i genhedaeth. Mae Narzullaev wedi arddangos ei waith mewn dros 100 o arddangosfeydd rhwngwladol, gan gynnwys UDA, Ffrainc, yr Almaen, Siapan, Pacistan a Kuwait. Terry Davies (y DU/yr Eidal)





Liming Zhang (Tsieina)



Graddiodd Liming Zhang o Adran Gerflunwaith Prifysgol Serameg Jingdezhen yn 2011. Ynghyd â Mr. Masakazu Kusakabe adeiladodd odyn goed ddi-fwg gyntaf Tsieina yn y Gweithdy Crochenwaith yn Jingdezhen yn 2008. (Bu Masakazu Kusakabe yn arddangos ei waith yn yr Wylyol Serameg Ryngwladol yn 2009). Yn 2010, cynhyrchodd odyn goed fechan y gellid ei defnyddio i danio, a dyma oedd ei ddylluniad ar gyfer ei raddio. Yn 2012, dechreuodd astudio gyda'r artist o Taiwan Wu Qizheng. Yn 2016, buont yn sefydlu eu stiwdio eu hunain yn Jingdezhen. Nic Collins (y DU)

Ym 1988 symudodd i Ddyfnaint a sefydlodd ei weithdy cyntaf yn Powdernills; yn 2000 symudodd i Moretonhamstead. Ymatebodd i'r amgylchedd gwledig gwylt trwy greu

2004 he was the author of five documentary films for UNESCO and in 2006 he edited the new English edition of the books by his father Mukhtidin Rakhimov (1903-1985) Artistic Ceramics of Uzbekistan and Architectural Ceramics of Uzbekistan. In 2012 he received the title of Honoured Art Worker of Uzbekistan. His studio in Tashkent has held several exhibitions and his works are in the Museum of Applied Art in Tashkent.

Alisher Nazirov



Alisher Nazirov from Rishtan in Eastern Uzbekistan is one of Uzbekistan's most celebrated ceramicists and teachers. Starting at the age of 12 he studied with some great Uzbek masters. In Soviet times he was the main artist at the Rishtan Art Ceramics Factory. Nazirov spent time in Japan in the mid-1990s and did an internship with Isojichi Asakura, the famous pottery master of Kutani school. Nazirov's contribution to maintaining the cultural heritage of Uzbekistan was to found a workshop-school the 'Usto-Shogird' [Master-Student] School. He has also been at the forefront of restoring the ancient traditional forms and designs of Rishtan ceramics, earning him the title of 'Keeper of the Traditions' in 2016. His works are included in museums in Uzbekistan, Russia and the Ceramics Museum Asakura-san in Komatsu.



Abdulla Narzullaev

Abdulla Narzullaev was born into a family with at least 6 generations of ceramics masters

and embroiderers before him. He is from Bukhara, a region renowned for its colourful glazed ceramics. He learned from his father starting at 7 years old. He admits that he never considered any another profession as craft in his family was passed from generation to generation. Narzullaev has exhibited his work in over a 100 international exhibitions, including in the USA, France, Germany, Japan, Pakistan and Kuwait. In 1992 he opened a museum of ceramics in Gijduvan, which also houses workshops for producing traditional Gijduvan ceramics.



Terry Davies (UK/Italy)

Terry Davies was born in the Welsh border town of Shrewsbury, Shropshire. His passion for clay began aged 11 and by the time he was 19 years old, he knew how to throw and control clay into any form needed. He gained a further artistic form of training from his extensive travels, starting with a period on Green Island Dorset, where he learned the techniques of salt and soda firing with Guy Sydneham. After a years' stay in the French pottery village of La Borne, his passion for wood firing had been established. He is known for his spectacle performance firings throughout Europe. Terry will build up to 8 small kilns from cotton, paper and clay around a bamboo Tipi frame. The kilns will be approximately two meters high and fueled by wood.

Liming Zhang (China)

Liming Zhang graduated from the Sculpture Department of Jingdezhen Ceramic University in 2011. Together with Mr. Masakazu Kusakabe he built China's first smokeless wood kiln at The Pottery Workshop in Jingdezhen in 2008. (Masakazu Kusakabe was a demonstrator at the ICF in 2009). In 2010, he produced a mini wood kiln which could be used for firing that became

his design for graduation. In 2012, Zhang studied sculptural kilns with Taiwan artist Wu Qizheng. In 2016, they set up our own studio in Jingdezhen. He has become known for his miniature wood-fired kilns which can be



built by amateur and hobby potters. Liming is building two mini kilns, one to be fired with locally sourced charcoal and the other to be fired with wood.



Nic Collins (UK)

After training at Derby College of Art, Nic Collins widened his experience by working as a thrower in potteries in Italy and Germany. In 1988 he moved to Devon and set up his first workshop at Powdermills and in 2000 moved to Moretonhamstead. He responded to the wild rural environment by making pots often with locally sourced clay and wood firing techniques. He is influenced by older pottery traditions and kilns as well as adaptations and experiments to create contemporary work. He is part of a group of experimental wood-firers including the potters, Clive Bowen and Svend Bayer who sometimes assist at each other's kiln firings. For ICF 2019, Nic will be making a ground hog type wood fired cross draft kiln. This activity is sponsored by Cromartie Hobbycraft.

Jean-François Bourlard began his professional training of traditional wheel-throwing in 1996, at the EMA CNIFOP International Centre for Training in Crafts and Ceramics in Saint-Amand-en-Puisaye, France. He gained experience in workshops throughout France and Germany, until 1999 when he returned to his hometown of Sadirac to set up his own practice. In 2012 he won the Ateliers d'Art de France Foundation Award that funded further experimentation in his work and launched punk raku into international recognition.

Valérie Blaize graduated from the Fine Arts School, Bordeaux (Visual arts) in 2017. Since 2014, Jean-François Bourlard and Valérie Blaize have worked together, developing their “Raku Punk” performance. They will create a performance especially for the ICF for Saturday night to begin after dark on Saturday and last 45 minutes.

Elin is interested in deconstructing and reconfiguring thrown forms to explore tension in the clay in order to build dynamic sculptural vessels. She will demonstrate throwing her sculptural components and secondly the constructing together of these sections when leather hard. This second half is an exciting, unpredictable process as she

works with the nuances of each new vessel form, improvising and working in response to the clay's shifting centre of gravity.

Ross Andrews



MRES Ceramics.

Cardiff School of Art and Design

Workshop: Digital craft in collaboration with traditional hand-skill process.

Ross is investigating questions of embodiment in terms of the extended ‘reach’ afforded through technologies such as the internet. His practice took shape through the combination of digital technology, 3D modelling software, CAD and the analogue traditional skills of mould making and casting ceramics. This work directly takes digitally captured terrain, in this instance the Welsh valleys of the Brecon Beacons and translates it into a vessel. The demonstration will show the skill of pouring and opening a plaster mould, refining of pre-cast and fired examples as well as a video demonstration of the digital process behind the 3D printed objects.

Magdalene Odundo (Kenya, y DU)



Teitl y Ddarlith: 'Taith Pethau'.

Ganwyd Magdalene Odundo yn Nairobi, Cenia a derbyniodd ei haddysg yng Nghenia a'r India. Daeth i Brydain ym 1971, ac astudiodd yn Surrey yn y Coleg Celf Brenhinol. Mae hi wedi teithio ledled Ewrop, America ac Afrika, yn tynnu ar ffynonellau amrywiol megis crochenwaith New Mexico, celf gorff Afrika Ganolig a ffuriau cerflunwaith Groegaidd cynnar. Adeiledir gwaith Odundo gyda'r llaw, yn defnyddio techneg torchi. Mae pob darran yn cael ei fwrrneisio, ei orchuddio gyda slip, a'i fwrrneisio eto. Nuala O'Donovan (Iwerddon)



Teitl y Ddarlith: 'Patrwm a Ffur'

Mae Nuala O'Donovan yn creu darnau cerfluniol porslen yn seiliedig ar geometreg ffurflau naturiol. Mae ei gwaith yn cyfuno patrwm rheolaidd gyda nodweddion ffurflau fractal o fyd natur. Mae'r ffurflau gorffenedig yn ganlyniad i ymateb greiddfol i'r cyfeiriad y mae'r patrwm yn cymryd, yn ogystal â'r afreolaidd-dra yn elfennau gwaith llaw y patrwm. Lectures

Matthew Blakely (UK)



Lecture title: 'Ceramic Landscapes - Pots made from British rocks and clays.'

Matthew's work explores the links between ceramics and geology and place. He makes pieces entirely from geological samples collected from specific locations around the country. He uses these materials as unrefined as possible: rocks are crushed by hand, milled and blended to create the glazes; clays are often used as dug straight from the ground. This work is fired using waste wood that has grown where he lives in Cambridgeshire. The firing itself transforms these glazes producing exceptional qualities that would be impossible to achieve in any other way.



Patricia Fay (USA)

Lecture title: 'In the Potters' Hands: Tracing Cultural Heritage in the Contemporary Caribbean.'

Patricia Fay is a Professor of Art in Ceramics and Assistant Director of the Bower School of Music & the Arts at Florida Gulf Coast University in Fort Myers, Florida, USA. Her recent book *Creole Clay: Heritage Ceramics in the Contemporary Caribbean* documents twenty-five years of research with potters in the region. Through images, interviews and video her lecture will explore the astonishing global legacies preserved in the hands of contemporary Caribbean potters.



Ingrid Murphy (Ireland/Wales)



Lecture title: 'Seen and Unseen'

Since 2015 Ingrid has led the University's Fab-Cre8 research group for applied research in digital technologies. She uses traditional as well as digital processes to make interactive artefacts which are non-functional yet function. She works collaboratively with others including sound technologists and engineers. Ingrid uses scanning and haptic technologies to explore the potential of form becoming sound and sound creating form. Ingrid will talk about her current exhibition 'Seen and Unseen' showing in Gallery 1.

Magdalene Odundo (Kenya UK)



Lecture title 'The Journey of Things'.

Magdalene Odundo was born in Nairobi, Kenya and educated in Kenya and India. Coming to Britain in 1971, she studied in

Surrey and at the Royal College of Art. She has travelled throughout Europe, America and Africa, drawing on sources as varied as the pottery of New Mexico, the body art of Central Africa, and the forms of early Greek sculpture. Odundo's work is hand built, using a coiling technique. Each piece is burnished, covered with slip, and then burnished again. The pieces are fired in an oxidizing atmosphere, which turns them a red-orange. A second firing in an oxygen-poor or reducing atmosphere causes the clay to turn black. Her work is highly regarded and is represented in major national and private collections. She was appointed an Officer of the Order of the British Empire (OBE) for services to Art in 2008 and became Chancellor of the University of the Creative Arts in 2018. Magdalene will base her talk on her recent exhibition: *Magdalene Odundo The Journey of Things* at The Hepworth Wakefield.

Nuala O'Donovan (Ireland)



Lecture title: 'Pattern and Form'

Nuala O'Donovan makes porcelain sculptural pieces based on the geometry of natural forms. Her work combines regular pattern with the characteristics of fractal forms from nature. The finished forms are a result of an intuitive response to the direction that the pattern takes as well as the irregularity in the handmade elements of the pattern. She is interested in the contrasts and similarities between traditional Western aesthetics, which sought to portray beauty through classical geometry, and Eastern/Buddhist aesthetics of beauty, which celebrate the imperfection.

Henrietta graduated with a Diploma in Fine Art and Ceramics from CityLit in 2017. Her work stems from exploring the exotic. Through a fresh child-like perspective of the world, she portrays social scenes of poetic tenderness and humour. In her work she interweaves metaphors for embracing life's diversity of people and their cultures. It is playful, representing an innocent yet thought provoking relationship with the material form. She models and carves the clay by hand and paints with slips and glazes to achieve bright fresh-looking surfaces that are rich, diverse and tangible.



Ding Laing

Micaela Schoop



Micaela has a mixed cultural background and uses ceramics as a means to investigate issues of culture and identity, multi-culturalism and communication. She hand-paints surface decorations to both sculptural work and domestic pottery. She is influenced by surface patterns used by different people around the world, such as Kuba textiles and Iznik pottery. They are paired with different ceramic decorating traditions, such as black-on-black ceramics by the Pueblo potter Maria Martinez or English slipware.

Eusebio Sanchez



Eusebio studied at Royal College of Art where he did an MA in Ceramics and Glass, graduating in 2017. In the same year he won the FRESH award at the British Ceramic Biennial. His work is focused around coiling where he uses a method of exposing the coil and revealing the process often hidden in most ceramics works. He compares this to 3-D printing techniques, where his hands act like an analogue 3D printer and as a result his sculptures echo the aesthetic of this technology.

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




